On Friday 11th October 2024, pupils in Year 6 will complete an online, health-focussed questionnaire in school on their physical and mental health. After the questionnaire has been taken, parents will receive an email via the School Screener Portal detailing their child's answers and health professionals will meet with us at school to share an anonymised report so that we can see trends and address these in our PSHE curriculum.

By registering on the School Screener Portal, you will be able to receive the letter detailing your child's responses or, if you do not wish your child to take part, you can opt out of the questionnaire. Please note that the School Nursing Team will be dealing with all questions relating to the questionnaire.
