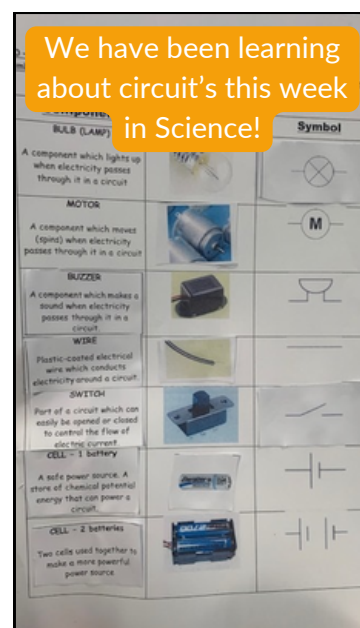

This week in Collective Worship, pupils have listened to the Parable of the Mustard Seed. The Mustard Seed parable highlights the idea that something seemingly insignificant can carry immense significance.
